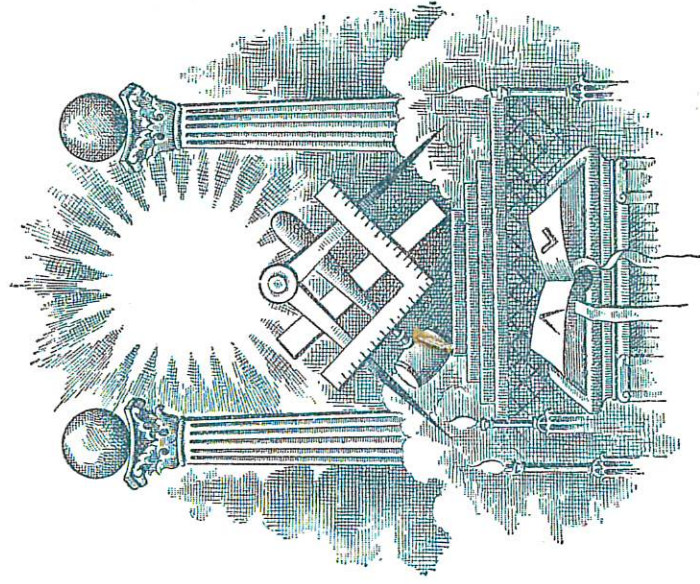

Amendment to By-Laws.

Article Four, Section One, of the By-Laws of Union Lodge, No. 291, F. & A. M., be altered and amended by striking out from said Section the following words, to wit:—
The first line and part of the second line of the said Section One, being the following words:— "All Petitions for Membership shall be accompanied with, a fee of \$10.00." So that the said Section One of Article Four, as amended, shall read as follows:—
"All Petitions for Initiation and Membership shall be accompanied with, \$20.00, which sum shall be considered a part of the fee. If the petition be withdrawn or the candidate rejected the money shall be returned, but if approved, and he does not come forward within six months thereafter, it shall be forfeited to the Lodge."
And that Article Five, Section One, of the said By-Laws shall be amended by striking out from the said Section One the following words:—

"For the admission of a Master Mason, \$10.00." By striking out from the said Section the figure "\$10.00" after the words "Initiation and Membership", and inserting in its place the figure "\$20.00". By striking out in the following clause, "For conferring the three Degrees by dispensation in addition to the expenses of the dispensation, the word "\$10.00" and inserting in its place and stead the word "\$20.00". By striking out in the following clause, "For the admission and advancement of an Entered Apprentice, \$30.00, the word "\$30.00" and inserting in its place and stead the word "\$20.00". By striking out in the following clause, "For the admission and advancement of a Fellow Craft, \$20.00, the word "\$20.00" and inserting in its place and stead the word "\$10.00". By striking out in the following clause, "For the admission and advancement of a Master Mason, \$10.00, the word "\$10.00" and inserting in its place and stead the word "\$20.00".

So that all for conferring Degrees and Membership shall be as follows, viz:—
"For Initiating and Membership, \$20.00."
"For conferring the three Degrees by dispensation in addition to the expenses of the dispensation, \$20.00."
"For the admission to Membership of Brother Masons as follows, viz:—
"For the admission and advancement of an Entered Apprentice, \$10.00,
"For the admission and advancement of a Fellow Craft, \$20.00,
"For the admission and advancement of a Master Mason, \$20.00."

Which fees, subject to the provisions of Section One, Article Four, shall in all cases be payable in advance.
That Section Two of said Article Five shall be amended by striking out therefrom the word "\$10.00" and inserting in its place and stead the word "\$20.00" so that Section Two of Article Five shall read as follows:—
"Should a Brother who has received his Degree in this Lodge by dispensation, having paid the above fee of \$20.00, be desirous of Membership, he may be admitted without the payment of any further fee, provided he makes application for Membership forthwith."
